“The 12th ANNUAL NECLIME MEETING, SEPTEMBER 27 – 29, 2011”

The Symposium **12th ANNUAL NECLIME MEETING** will be held in Bucharest, between 27th – 29th September 2011 in the National Geological Museum, being co-organized by [NECLIME](#) – the Neogene Climate Evolution in Eurasia Program and by [IGR](#) – the Geological Institute of Romania with the support of [RSP](#) – the Romanian Society of Paleontologists and [ANCS](#) - National Authority for Scientific Research.

Scientific Topics & Preliminary Schedule

At the 12th annual NECLIME meeting the actual research within the network will be presented including palaeoclimate and palaeoecology research as well as corresponding modeling studies according to the NECLIME 2020 objectives. The time frame considered covers the Neogene, with the early Pleistocene included. As contributions oral and poster presentations are welcome. Aside from regional to local topics the following special focal points are proposed

- Using fossil woods in palaeoclimate reconstructions
- Into the Icehouse: climate change and vegetation response at the Plio/Pleistocene transition
- Atmospheric CO₂
 - atmospheric CO₂ and Neogene climate change
 - implications of palaeo-altitude on CO₂ reconstructions from fossil plants
- Analysis of monsoonal patterns
 - quantifying monsoonal patterns by palaeobotanical proxies
 - identification of palaeo-elevation –the analysis of altitudinal floras
 - sensitivity studies with models (global and regional), analysis of tele-connections

During the final discussion everybody is strongly encouraged to take the opportunity to actively contribute to the debate on future scientific perspectives of NECLIME, defining goals and strategies for the next years.

Authors should complete the contact information for the Presenting Author (the Corresponding Author is considered to be the Presenting Author).
- The deadline for online registration and abstract submission is **24th of April**.
- Both oral and poster contributions are welcome. Poster dimensions should not exceed the A0 format. Oral presentations will only be accepted as PowerPoint presentation (.ppt) to run on a Windows-based computer attached to a videobeamer.
- The Conference Proceedings will be published as special volume of the Anuarul IGR (the Yearbook of the Geological Institute of Romania - <http://www.igr.ro>). For scientific papers will be recommended the Acta Palaeontologica Romaniae (<http://www.geo-paleontologica.org/page4.html>) or Carpathian Journal of Earth and Environmental Sciences (<http://www.ubm.ro/sites/CJEES/>).

Location of Symposium is the National Geological Museum, Romania, 2nd Kiseleff Avenue, RO-011345 Bucharest. General Information

Language

- The official language of the conference will be English. No translation facilities will be available.

Insurance

- The organizers of the conference recommend that participants arrange their own insurance for health, travel and property. The organizers will not accept any liability for personal injury or for loss of, or damage to, property.

Clothing and weather

- Romania has a temperate continental climate. At the end of September the weather is usually pleasant, the maximum temperature may reach 25-30 °C. Nevertheless, showers may occur.

Bank and currency exchange

- The currency is the RON. The relation could be: 1 euro=4.2 RON; 1 USD=3.05 RON (the Romanian money is usually named Leu – Lei. Notes are in denominations of Lei 500; 200; 100; 50; 10; 5; 1. Coins are in denominations of ban-bani 50; 10; 5 and 1).
- Delegates may change foreign currency and travelers' cheques at the airport upon arrival in Bucharest, and also at many exchange bureaus, at the railway station or in most of the hotels.
- International credit cards are accepted for payment in hotels, restaurants and shops. Credit and debit cards can be used to withdraw money from ATMs.
- The organizers recommend that participants exchange money exclusively in authorized money exchange offices and retain all exchange receipts.

Electricity

- Electricity in Romania is 220 Volts, alternating at 50 cycles per second. If you travel to Romania with a device that does not accept 220 Volts at 50 Hertz, you will need a voltage converter. European-style two-pin plugs are used.

Mobile telephone

- GSM dual band 900/1800, see GSM World Coverage Map (<http://www.worldtimezone.com/gsm.html>).
- Main network operators include Vodafone, Orange, Cosmote with coverage throughout the country.

Fee Payment

The Registration fee of 100 Euros will be paid on-site. After having received full payment of the Registration fee on-site a receipt and a letter of confirmation will be remitted.

Registration fee does not include accommodation.

Accommodation - Hotel Reservation
