We are delighted to invite you to participate in the **24th Annual NECLIME Conference**, which will be held in Almaty, Kazakhstan from **September 9**<sup>th</sup> **to 14**<sup>th</sup>, **2024**. We are looking forward to your registrations and to seeing you in Almaty!

## **NECLIME Annual Conference (September 9 - 10)**

## Main scientific topics

We kindly invite presentations based on data from all kinds of proxies and methods. This explicitly includes animals, fungi, geochemical proxies and modeling. We also would like to encourage young scientists to present their work and take part in the discussions.

## Evolution of climate, vegetation, biogeography in (Central) Asia

With the location of our venue in the middle of Central Asia, we would like to give the discussion of our well-established NECLIME topics paleoclimate, paleovegetation and paleoenvironment a regional focus. Analyses of the interactions between paleogeography, vegetation, fauna and climate in combination with biome modeling approaches are potential topics to shed light on the evolution of Asian environments. Following the current NECLIME topic extremes of climate and environments, our main focus here may be the extreme dry or continental climate (as seen today in Kazakhstan), its evolution and impact on vegetation and ecosystems.

## Drivers of Past Biodiversity

Diving deeper into the questions of the history of biodiversity, we would like to discuss potential drivers that have shaped present and past diversity. The history and natural variability of plant diversity may shed light on such driving forces such as climate, mountain uplift, CO<sub>2</sub> and more. Animals and fungi as important constituents of biodiversity may also be considered here.

## Open scientific topics of NECLIME related fields

As always, contributions on all topics related to NECLIME are appreciated and highly welcome to present the variety of NECLIME research.

#### The Venue

The conference will be held at the Institute of Geological Science, 69 Kabanbay batyr str., Almaty, Kazakhstan

#### **Conference fee**

The conference fee of **150 EUR** includes a welcome party, coffee breaks, lunches, an abstract volume, conference excursions, and other conference facilities, and is payable on site.

#### **Travel and accommodation**

There are several hotels within walking distance of the conference venue.

From Almaty International Airport you can leave by cab. More detailed information about accommodation and transport will be sent to you after registration.

## Post-conference field trip

On September 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> we offer an excursion to the national natural parks of Charyn and Altyn-Emel, located 250 km southeast of Almaty. This area presents Paleogene-Neogene lake and river sediments, which contain the remains of fauna and flora of the Paleogene, Neogene and Quaternary periods. These archives allow to reconstruct the main stages of formation of the arid zone of Eurasia and changes in landscapes from the plain savannahs of the Paleogene to the foothill deserts of the Quaternary period.

The cost of the excursion will be about **200 EUR** at the current exchange rate. The price includes transfer (off-road vehicles), hotel accommodation, meals (including field lunches), and other amenities.

More detailed information will be sent to you after registration.

#### Visa

Kazakhstan has a **visa-free regime** for citizens of 54 countries (including India, China, Iran) for 14 to 30 days. You can check at https://new.wpk.kz/kaz\_entry\_eng.

After registration of those who need it, we will send an official invitation to apply for a visa. Please let us know in time if you require an official invitation.
